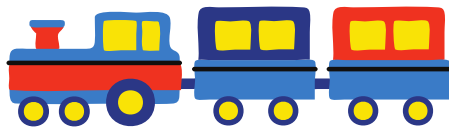

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM



PLAY BASED AND CHILD-DIRECTED CURRICULUM

In the Omaroo room, the educators focus on building the children's independence and confidence in their skills and abilities.

For the younger group, we focus on guiding them through improving their verbal skills and communication, as well as helping them hone their fine and gross motor skills.

For the older group getting ready to go into the kindergarten room, we, with the support of the families, start building their confidence in toilet training. We guide them to start listening to their body's cues and signals, recognising what it feels like when they need to use the toilet.



ROOM ROUTINE

| 6:30am - 8:30am | Arrival & Breakfast | Children arrive and educators welcome them in to the family grouping area in the Kinder room (Quindalup). Breakfast options include cereal, toast & fruits. |
| 8:30am - 9:00am | Moving to Omaroo room | Toddlers are moved to their own room and engage in indoor play. Some more toast is available if they wish to have. |
| 9:30am - 9:45am | Morning Tea, Nappies & Toilet Training | Morning tea is offered, which consists of some cut up fruit. Older children are encouraged to go to the toilet and morning nappies are changed during this time. |
| 9:45am - 10:00am | Group Time | Children sit together with the educators for a group discussion, sing & dance, read a story, etc. Children are encouraged to dress themselves with jackets and hats, as well as sunscreen when needed. |
| 10:00am - 11:00am | Outdoor Play | Children have some time to play outdoors in the yard. Outdoor planned program is implemented. Nappies and toilet runs are started at 10:30am. |
| 11:00am - 11:45am | Lunch | Lunch is served - the item on the weekly menu board is served for children to dish up themselves. Children clean up their own space by washing their bowls, and cleaning their hands and face with a cloth |
| 12:00pm - 2:00pm | Nap Time | Children have a nap/rest on mats covered with a thin sheet. Children with sleep limits or have dropped their naps will have quiet play time. Nappies and toilet runs are done once they wake up. |
| 2:00pm - 2:30pm | Afternoon Tea | Afternoon tea is served, which consists of some cut up fruit and a sweet/savoury treat with a cup of milk. |
| 2:30pm - 4:00pm | Outdoor Play | Children head out into the yard for some more outdoor play. Nappies and toilet training is started at 3:30pm. |
| 4:00pm - 4:30pm | Late Snack | Children enjoy a late afternoon snack of some sandwiches outdoors, depending on the weather. |
| 4:30pm - 5:45pm | Family Grouping | Quindalup (Preschool) children combine with the Omaroo children outdoors to spend some time playing together. Children start getting picked up at this time. |

SUSTAINABLE ENVIRONMENT

At KOQP, we prioritise eco-friendly materials and practices whenever possible. Utilising loose parts and recyclable materials in different ways to learn and create.
